Pupil Premium Funding Report for expenditure and impact 2017-18

Background

The Pupil Premium Grant is an allocation of additional funding provided to schools to support specific groups of children who are vulnerable to underachievement.

Pupils eligible for Pupil Premium are:

- Pupils who are eligible for Free School Meals (FSM)
- Ever 6 entitlement to Pupil Premium is the number of children who have been registered as eligible for free school meals at any point in the last 6 years (£1,320.00)
- Children who have been looked after continuously for more than 6 months (£1,900.00)
- Children of armed services personnel (£300.00)

1:1 tuition by Teachers	£14,590.00 £8,691.00	<p>The disadvantaged children received both 1:1 and small group sessions for literacy and numeracy skills. Some, but not all achieved national standards, however all achieved their individual progress targets.</p> <p>There were also small group sessions undertaken by teachers to support disadvantaged Year 6 pupils preparing for the national testing.</p>

Learning Support Assistant 50% of hours dedicated to disadvantaged pupil support.	£6,869.50	A designated teaching assistant worked across the school to support disadvantaged pupils across the curriculum.
Trips/Music lessons	£417.00	One child had individual music lessons to raise his self- confidence and increase his social interactions. Trips are paid for by the school to ensure the engagement of disadvantaged pupils in the wider school curriculum.
Uniform	£174.00	One family were supported in the purchase of school uniform for all three children.
Free School Meals	£2750.00	FSM are provided for all children who meet the criteria. In addition we support families who are experiencing financial difficulties.
1 hour dedicated SLT support	£607.00	An SLT member dedicated one hour per week to all things related to disadvantaged pupils. Providing support and monitoring progress. This enabled her to more fully report to SLT and Governors re progress and outcomes for our disadvantaged pupils.
Lunch Time Nurture Group	£2,242.50	To increase confidence, build self-esteem and broaden pupil's emotional development. The group was well attended throughout the year,
